## **What Labor Day means**

Labor Day is a federal holiday in the United States celebrated on the first Monday in September to honor and recognize the American labor movement and the works and contributions of laborers to the development and achievements of the United States.

Though it may be known as the unofficial end of summer, Labor Day is actually a day to celebrate the achievements of workers. According to History.com, Labor Day originated at a time when working conditions in the U.S. were often poor and unsafe.

At the time Labor Day was formed, unions were fighting for "very specific improvements in their working conditions," Freeman said. Workers were fighting hard for the eight-hour work day most workers enjoy today. And Labor Day was an opportunity for them to come together to discuss their priorities – and for the country to acknowledge the contributions workers make to society.

Labor Day was first celebrated unofficially by labor activists and individual states in the late 1800s, according to the US Department of Labor. New York was the first state to introduce a bill recognizing Labor Day, but Oregon was the first to actually codify it into law in 1887. Colorado, Massachusetts, New Jersey and New York had followed suit by the end of 1887.

It wasn't until June 28, 1894 that Congress passed an act naming the first day of September a legal holiday called Labor Day.

National Grandparents Day has more than one origin. Some people consider it to have been first proposed by Michael Goldgar in the 1970s after he visited his aunt in an Atlanta nursing home, Spending \$11,000 of his own money in lobbying efforts to have the day officially recognized, he made 17 trips to Washington DC over a seven-year span to meet with legislators.

Others consider Marian Lucille Herndon McQuade, a housewife in West Virginia, to have been the main driver for the day of observance. Throughout the 1970s McQuade worked hard to educate the people about the important contributions senior citizens made and the contributions that they would be willing to make if asked. She also urged people to adopt a grandparent, not for one day a year and not for material giving, but for a lifetime of experience.

In any event National Grandparents Day was finally signed into law by President Jimmy Carter in 1978. Marian McQuade received a phone call from the White House to advise her of this event. Many people believe that National Grandparents Day was inspired by her efforts. A presidential proclamation on September 6, 1979, made this day official – it designated Sunday, September 9, 1979, (being the "first Sunday of September following Labor Day") as National Grandparents Day.

Each year the President is requested to issue a proclamation to: designate the first Sunday in September after Labor Day as National Grandparents Day; and to call on people, groups and organizations to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.

The official song of National Grandparents Day is "A Song for Grandma And Grandpa" by Johnny Prill. The official flower for the day is the "forget-me-not" flower.

This year we invite you to extend your service opportunities from Sunday, Sept. 8, through Oct. 16, which is World Food Day. We know that, every day, our congregations are doing the work of loving their neighbors and improving their communities. "God's work. Our hands." Every day. "GOD'S WORK. OUR HANDS.": SHARING GOD'S GRACE AND LOVE AS Lutherans, we know the difference that God's grace and love in Christ have made in our daily lives. Because of this, we work together to help others experience that same love and acceptance. We live out this vision through worship and service in our congregations and communities, through our individual vocations and through our collective work as church together. "God's work. Our hands." offers a special opportunity to be church together and to share Jesus' love by inviting others to join

in a day of service. This call for service unites all the ELCA expressions to focus on serving and accompanying our neighbors.

- 1. New ELCA Presiding Bishop was elected at recent ELCA Assembly. Bishop Yiehiel Curry. Recently served as Bishop in Chicago area. Elected for six year term.
- 2. Revised Common Lectionary which many denominations use for church year lessons is revised. Lessons will reflect more inclusivity.
- 3. The ELCA Social Statement on marriage was revised by ELCA Assembly vote to remove reference to marriage being between a "man" and "woman". In my opinion and observation, our beloved ELCA has taken another step to recognize sacredness of gender diversity in marriage.
- 4. The New Revised Standard Bible has been updated to reflect new scholarly insights into ancient Biblical languages and modern English expression.

## **THRIVENT**

Thrivent Choice "Make a Personal Donation" Maybe you have heard it said many times "follow the prompts" to make a personal donation and have no clue what that actually means or how it works! So here's a little cheat sheet, I did some exploring to figure it out.

First of all, you don't have to be a Thrivent member to use this feature.

Second, it's a way to give via your credit card and rack up more points or miles and the organization (New Hope or someplace else) will get a record of your personal donation and should track that gift for you in the same way as if you had put a check in an envelope, it should be recorded by them for you

Third of all this is DIFFERENT than designating Thrivent Choice dollars for those of you who are Thrivent members
Fourth, it's not so easy as just having a link which is specific to New Hope, maybe we will do that in time, for now below is a cheat sheet to help you if you want to use the Thrivent choice personal donation system

- 1. go to thrivent.com
- 2. search box type in "thrivent choice"
- 3. once in thrivent choice click on "make a personal donation"
- 4. follow remaining prompts which are self explanatory
